











Figure 2: Contraceptive use by non-pregnant women by time since last live birth








Fig. 6.1 Hypothetical case of expenditure of reproductive "muscles" and strength over a lifetime









Fig. 8.3 The domestic career of a man and his sequence of wives




Husband's vs. wife's view of birth interval length


